Fearful, lest Your Majesty sh^d think me remiss in any one point of my duty, I could not suffer the Courier to depart without doing myself the honour of sending Your Majesty these few lines, merely to acquaint Your Majesty, that having observed of late that His Royal Highness was a good deal troubled with a cough, & with very frequent bleedings at the nose, I thought proper to advise His Royal Highness to consult Mons^r Zimmermann upon it, who immediately prescribed a pretty copious bleeding, & some few medicines, which, I am happy to inform Your Majesty, seem to have had a very good effect, as the cough is certainly much diminished, & I make no doubt, of His Royal

Highness could be persuaded to observe for a little
time a course of Regimen, & not overheat
his blood by taking too violent exercise, he would
be cured of his Cough in a very short time.
I shall endeavour as much as possible to persuade
His Royal Highness to submit for a little while
to the Rules Mr Zimmerman prescribes, as
I wish very much to see His Royal Highness
quite free from this cough, which, though by no
means violent, yet continues to lay upon him
longer than it sh^d do.
