Lord Liverpool presents his humble Duty to
Your Royal Highness, and having communi-
cated with Your Royal Highness's Confidential
servants, upon the Subject of the Provision since
it would be proper to connect with the Honours
recently conferred upon Marquis Wellington, in
consequence of his great and meritorious Services,
They are all of Opinion that it would be
more advisable to propose to Parliament to
vote a Sum of Money, than to make any Addition
to the Sum already granted: and they
are further of Opinion, that under all
the Circumstances, and adverted to the State
of Lord Wellington's Private Fortune, and the
Expenses to which for Public Purposes
he

he has been ^{necessarily} ~~deposed~~ that sum may
not improperly be paid at One Hundred
Thousand Pounds.

Lord Liverpool humbly requests the
if this Opinion should meet with your
Royal Highnesses gracious approbation that
you would be pleased to authorize Lord
Liverpool to inform Lord Wellington that
it was your Royal Highnesses Intention
to give Directions to your Comptroller
General to propose to Parliament upon
its next Meeting, to grant a Provision
to the extent above stated
