My Dear Sir

Being under the necessity of leaving
Town, & therefore unable to attend the
Prince Regent's Levee on Thursday
next, I take the liberty of requesting
your protection for the Son of a very
respectable friend of mine, (the late
Coll: St George brother of Sir John Cordock)

I believe that Coll: St George had
the honor of H. R. H.'s countenance for
many years. Mr St George the bearer
of this Letter inherits a considerable
(R. A. S. MacMahon) property

property in Ireland from his late
Father, & is heir to his Mother (still
living) whose name was Chenevis, &
who brought a large fortune & estate
to the late Colonel St George.

Your uniform kindness to me induces
me to hope that you will pardon
this trouble, & that you will have
the goodness to mention Mr St
George's name to the Justice
Regent.
