late concerted Illness from the
Gongesses of the so many of the
Royal Burghs of Scotland.

The Prince had not at the
time an opportunity of acknowledging
of the receipt of them as he wish'd
but understanding that Delegates
from the different Burghs were
in convention on the 12th of
this month is His Royal Highness

of 20 August and 14 September 1789, and is directed to
Robert Graham, Esq., of the Convention of Delegates, From the
Burgesses of the Royal Burghs of Scotland, associated for the
purpose of Reform, and assembled at Edinburgh."
