Since my return from Cheltenham I have read your Statement of Certain Regimental Transactions which it is entirely out of my present Intention to either Comment, or touch upon. But possessing the Conviction that every part of my Conduct in that business, relating to which I had been concerned was govern'd not only by a strict Sense of Honour, but conducted with all possible politeness & Civility towards you Individually, I cannot but feel most extremely wounded at the Reflections of "Unfairness & Partiality" with which you have there alluded to me.

I have therefore to desire ^{Sir,} not as a Servant to the Prince of Wales which I have the Honour to be, but merely as from One Gentleman to another to know distinctly whether any Personal Offence was intended by you, to be conveyed to me, by those Expressions, or not.
