The grandfather was the possessor of the
works of the late King. The father had the com-

His late Majesty and Captain Cause himself
I placed by the desire of the late King at the
Academy of Woolwich from whence he rose
with distinction in the Royal Artillery. The
particulars ^{are} detailed in the Memorial of Mrs
Cause and I have to request your will in my
name present it to the King and represent
the case of the two daughters whose allowance
it is the earnest wish of the mother to have in-
creased by the Royal munificence. Beyond
the present pensions to the mother and daughters

they have not a farthing and I know I shall find
to be an excellent and deserving woman.
